DID YOU KNOW...

In March, Lt General David H. Berger was nominated by President Trump to serve as the 38th Commandant of the Marine Corps. His appointment as Commandant requires Senate confirmation. Upon confirmation, he will pin on his fourth star.

Lt Gen Berger is a former infantry platoon commander and Recon Marine. He currently serves as the commander of Marine Corps Combat Development Command and Deputy Commandant for Combat Development and Integration, in Quantico, Virginia.

- -The Commandant is not necessarily the highest-ranking officer in the Marine Corps, but the position makes him senior to all other officers regardless of rank
- -The Commandant is a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and reports to the Secretary of the Navy, but not to the Chief of Naval Operations
- -The Commandant is responsible for keeping the Marine Corps in fighting condition, but he does not serve as a direct battlefield commander

Sgt Major Troy Black has been selected to take over as 19th Sgt Major of the Marine Corps. He enlisted in 1988 and has an extensive resume of deployments under his belt, including Operations Iraqi and Enduring Freedom, Operation Desert Storm/Desert Shield, and more.

Throughout his career he's been awarded the Legion of Merit with Gold Star, Bronze Star with Combat Distinguishing Device, Meritorious Service Medal with two Gold Stars, the Combat Action Ribbon with two Gold Stars, and more. He's previously served as Sergeant Major of Officer Candidates School, the 11th Marine Expeditionary Unit, and the 1st Marine Logistics Group.

- -The Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps is selected by the Commandant of the Marine Corps and serves as the senior enlisted advisor to the Commandant. It is typically a four-year post, but service is left to the discretion of the Commandant
- -The position of Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps was established in 1957. True to Marine Corps fashion, it was the first position of its kind in any of the branches of the United States armed forces
